Amanda first joined the Crown Solicitor's Office in 2005, in the Administrative Law team. She spent some time away teaching Constitutional Law and Administrative Law at the University of Notre Dame Australia and Administrative Law at the University of New South Wales. During this time, she also completed her PhD at the University of Sydney on judicial review of non-statutory executive action. Amanda re-joined the Crown Solicitor's Office in 2019 and was a Senior Solicitor in the Constitutional and Administrative Law team until the end of 2021. In this role, she represented agencies in administrative reviews before NCAT and instructed counsel in judicial review applications and other applications in the Supreme Court, Court of Appeal and High Court. She also advised on statutory interpretation issues and intervention by the Attorney General in constitutional law matters.

In May 2022, Amanda will join the NSW Bar as a Reader on Level 22 Chambers.
