Associate Professor Robertson specialises in Forensic Psychiatry, Ethics and the Law in Medicine. He holds the following qualifications and accreditations: Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery, University of NSW (1991), Fellowship Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists (1998) and Doctor of Philosophy University of Sydney (2009).
