Kieran Pender is a writer, lawyer and academic based in Canberra. He is a senior lawyer at the Human Rights Law Centre, an honorary lecturer at the ANU College of Law and an award-winning journalist contributing to *The Guardian*.

Kieran is a recognised expert on addressing workplace bullying and sexual harassment. As a senior legal advisor at the International Bar Association in London, he led the landmark *Us Too?* review into inappropriate workplace behaviour in the legal profession and subsequent global campaign. Kieran was also part of an ANU College of Law team (together with Emerita Professor Margaret Thornton and Madeleine Castles) that undertook research into damages and costs in discrimination litigation, for the Attorney-General's Department in fulfilment of recommendations in the landmark Respect@Work Report.

Kieran serves on the advisory council of the Global Institute for Women's Leadership, a joint initiative of the ANU and King's College London, and the diversity and inclusion committee of the NSW Law Society. He is also a director of Women Onside and volunteers in the employment practice at Redfern Legal Centre.
