Greg Channell

Greg Channell is currently a Solicitor and eConveyancing Consultant. He was formerly Director, Legal/Industry Engagement/Governance in the Office of the Registrar General and in that capacity, Greg played a key role in developing the legal framework for electronic conveyancing nationally.

Greg has over 35 years experience providing legal and policy advice to the NSW Registrar General and the land registry. In his former role Greg was the legal adviser to the Registrar General on the implementation of Electronic Conveyancing, regulatory responsibilities of the Australian Registrars' National Electronic Conveyancing Council (ARNECC), National consistency issues and conveyancing reform generally.

Greg had responsibility for the enactment of a wide variety of land related legislation in NSW, including reform of the Torrens Assurance Fund and more recently all of the legislation related to electronic conveyancing, including the Electronic Conveyancing National Law, which has been adopted or reproduced in all participating jurisdictions.
